5. Skipper's report 1989 to 1990

The Skipper first referred to the paradox of another perfect summer with heat wave conditions and the resultant deterioration in the fairways. Last year more people played in matches and in competitions and there were more competitions. The average number playing golf in the main competitions increased from 26.6 to 28.2, the best supported event was the Barrell Foursomes with 40 taking part, compared with 24 in previous years. As a result of this, we have not to accept a suggestion from the club to move the ladies matches to a Friday afternoon, starting at 1 pm when the course is reported to be empty. The numbers have been reduced to 26. The ladies took some of the initiative as regard to both day and numbers.

The Skipper concluded by saying that he had had a good year in office and had great satisfaction in serving the section as Skipper. The keen support of members of the committee had stimulating. John Quilter and Geoff Watson are retiring from the committee and deserve every praise and thanks not only for routine work but for innovations. Eric Foster had done an excellent job and was a tower of strength. The contributions of John Harland as Match Secretary and Roy Douse for his liaison work with the Club were gratefully acknowledged.

Thanks are also due to Douglas Boag for his help, to Derek Blades and his staff in a difficult year, to Ashley Carter and to Mrs Johnson.

6. The Centenary Levy.

9. Any Other Business.

10. Thanks to the outgoing Skipper were proposed by Peter Brown and seconded by Ron White. This was passed with general acclaim and the meeting closed at 4.02 pm.
