6. Election of Officers

The retiring Skipper invited the Skipper for 2004, A Froggatt, to take the chair.

The new Skipper stated that he was honoured to be elected Skipper and wished the Seniors a good golfing year in 2004.

7. Any other business

a. D Hutchison's Letter

D Hutchison addressed the meeting raising the following points:-

- 1. Funding the away day This subject was discussed at great length, concluding that if funds permitted a subsidy would be provided from the Seniors account.
- 2. <u>Supply of wine at away day dinner</u> Referring to the provision of wine at away days, this should be at the discretion of the Skipper.
- 3. Aborted competitions D Hutchison raised the subject of competitions being aborted after being started. He stated that if players wished to continue in inclement weather they deserve the right to complete the competition. Consensus was that it should be the Skipper's decision to abort a competition.

Proposed – P Horsburgh Seconded – M Wood

Seniors Raffle

Bob Tompkins questioned that the profit from the Seniors raffle should not go into the Seniors account but should go to charity. The consensus of opinion was that the money should be used at the Committee's discretion.

Prizes - Away Days

Wally Holt suggested that we re-introduce the wine raffle on the Winter League days to provide prizes at the away days. He volunteered to organize the raffle, members to provide the wine.

Proposed – W Holt Seconded – D Trafford

Winter League Scoring

Ray Ingram raised the concerns of members over the new points system introduced for the Winter League. He stated that we should revert back to the old system based on a Better Ball Stableford score.

Proposed – R Ingram Seconded – D Croucher

Other comments - G Maslin suggested we try the new system for one year.

E Clarke stated that it was unfair to award the points on a count back, i.e. if three teams had 46 points per team they should be awarded 13 points each, not based on a count back on the back nine.

Conclusion – The Skipper gave an overview on why he had decided to change the scoring system. He then proposed that we should take a vote on which scoring system we should use. The vote was 13 for the new system and 12 against.

Therefore the new scoring method will be used for 2003/2004, to be reviewed by the Committee for future years.

There being no other business to be discussed Skipper Alan thanked everyone for their attendance and closed the meeting at 3.30 pm.
